BSU Surpasses National Passing Rates in 4 Licensure Examinations

State University's College Benguet of Nursing, College of Agriculture, College of Home Economics and Technology, and College of Teacher Education sustained stellar performance during their respective licensure examination.

The College of Nursing produced 127 licensed nurses with a historical 100% passing rate surpassing the national passing rate of 74.40% and bagging the highest spot in the list of top-performing schools following the Nurse Licensure Examination last November 2022. The college also produced four topnotchers, Ms. Krixanne Gwyneth M. Colas & Karia Karina E. Dela Cruz who landed Top 7 with an 88.90% average; Ms. Janille M. Beray landed with 88.40% average landed Top 9; Ms. Stefanie S. Banawa landed Top 10 with 88.20% average. Benguet State University is one of two universities in the Cordillera Administrative Region to garner a 100% passing rate along with Saint Louis University.

Additionally, the College of Agriculture produced 246 agriculturists following the Agriculturist Licensure licensed Examination last November 2022, with 54.47% overall performance surpassing the national passing rate of 34.57%. Ms. Tiffanie Grace Calion Bengeg garnered Top 7 with an 85.33% average.

Furthermore, the College of Home Economics and Technology

BSU ATBI/IC Pilots First Incubatee Summit in the Philippines



He appreciated BSU employees and stakeholders for the efforts and partnerships that led to the achievements of the University. He further emphasized the importance of accountability and cooperation among the employees in fulfilling the University's Vision, Mission, and Development Goals (VMDG).

"We will continue this (his leadership) prayerfully, purposely, with focus and with precision so that we will reach the dream, the drive, the destiny," he ended.

The occasion highlighted this year's accomplishments of the University's different sectors, including the Academic, Research and Extension, Business Affairs, Office of the President, Administration and Finance through a video presentation. Highlighted accomplishments were the new degree programs offered, increased number of enrollees and graduates of the University, performances in licensure examinations, students and faculty awards in various fields, research and publication accomplishments, ISO certification, among others.

In addition, sector Vice-presidents Dr. Samuel Salay Poliden, Atty. Allan Casaldo Sacpa, Dr. Johnny Guzman Dati, Sr., and Dr. Norma Palaci Banania presented the 2023 plans, programs, and projects for the University in line with its four-fold functions: instruction, research, extension, and production.

The academic affairs sector aims to support the BSU extension classes in Kapangan, Kabayan, and Itogon. The sector also extends efforts for the permanency of qualified COS faculty members, opening new courses such as Medicine and Accountancy and others, and more Certificate of Program Compliance (COPC) accredited programs bv Commission on Higher Education (CHED) and a higher level of accreditation and world rankings.

The administration finance sector also plans to continue improving the different office processes, increase Civil Service Commission **PRIME** Maturity Level, improve the faculty and staff development program, intensify implementation the RA 9003 or Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000, and increase the utilization and disbursement rate.

The research and extension sector's goals are to

package gender-sensitive and Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Time-bound Relevant, and (SMART) proposals, implement and disseminate results, submit a proposal for the Science and Technology Hub, re-structure the research and extension, revise the Research and Extension Manual of Operation (REMO), and expand international collaboration in R&E programs.

To help achieve the presented targets, programs, and projects, the business affairs sector, on the other hand, focused on increasing the revenue and collections from the different Income Generating Projects (IGP) centers of the University, as one of the fund sources for BSU expenses. Dr. Banania said that BSU employees can help support to increase the University's income by purchasing BSU products and advertising them to relatives and friends.

Moreover, the realization of BSU's VMDG would not be possible without the assistance of line agencies and other stakeholders. Distinguished guests and LGU officials then expressed commitment and support for the University in its journey to a higher University.

produced 66 licensed Nutritionist-Dietitian surpassing the national passing rate of 64.54% with an 80.30% overall performance following the Nutritionist-Dietitian Licensure Examination last October 2022.

Moreover, the College of Teacher Education once again underlines the title "Center of Excellence for Teacher Education" as it surpassed the national passing rate for both Elementary and Secondary levels. The La Trinidad Campus produced 140 licensed teachers at the elementary level with an overall performance of 87.17% and 367 licensed teachers at the secondary level with an overall performance of 75.48%, surpassing the national passing rate of 54.45% for the elementary level and 50.94% for secondary level following the Licensure Examination for Professional Teachers last October 2022. Additionally, the college produced a topnotcher in the person of Mr. Nathaniel Onnan Latos, who landed the top 8 with a 93.00% average.

Meanwhile, the Bokod Campus produced 20 licensed teachers with a 70.00% overall performance at the elementary level and 39 licensed teachers at the secondary level with an overall performance of 58.97% while Buguias Campus produced 38 licensed teachers at the elementary level with an overall performance of 84.21% and 99 licensed teachers at the secondary level with an overall performance of 51.52%. BSU, DepEd-CAR Sign MOA on STN Project

Benguet State University, represented by President Felipe Salaing Comila, and the Department of Education-Cordillera Administrative Region (DepEd-CAR), represented by Regional Director Estela P. Leon-Cariño, signed a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) in support of

the DepEd-CAR's project, Salaknib Tan Namnama (STN) at the RDC Hall, Benguet State University last

November 3, 2022.

Salaknib Tan Namnama an Ibaloi phrase that means Saving or Protecting and Giving Hope, which aims to raise hope and restore the self-worth of learners who had undesirable histories brought about by the troubling experience of learners.

According to DepEd-CAR, the project was launched on December 3, 2020 to fulfill the objectives of the DepEd Indigenous Peoples Education Program and the Drop-Out Reduction Program. The project also intends to facilitate support to learners in marginalized, hard-to-reach, and vulnerable situations until they complete tertiary education.

"It's always good to be an educator," expressed Vice-President for Academic Affairs Dr. Samuel Salay Poliden and thanked DepEd-CAR for choosing BSU as a partner for the project. He added that the project is one of the realizations of the BSU's goal of expanding its campuses in

Benguet, as it will accommodate more students.

As stated in the MOA, the DepEd-CAR will nominate and recommend learner-beneficiaries to BSU for enrollment, accommodation to scholarship programs, and as student assistants in BSU offices and programs that support the continuity of education of the learner-beneficiaries.

Further,

supervise and monitor the educational performance of the learnerbeneficiaries and support the BSU plans beneficial to learnerbeneficiaries, especially in finishing their degrees. These provisions were agreed upon by BSU subject to its governing laws, rules, policies, and other pertinent laws such as the Data Privacy

The MOA signing was witnessed by BSU officials, STN committee members, three learner-beneficiaries, and a parent representative.

Pres. Comila applauded RD Leon-Cariño for initiating the project and expressed support to the learner-beneficiaries. He also showed generosity by donating 15,000 pesos to the 15 learner-beneficiaries enrolled in the University.

RD Leon-Cariño thanked BSU for the partnership and expressed optimism despite the challenges they encountered with the project. "Hopefully this project will become a program and institutionalized... Thank you to BSU, and we hope this signing of the MOA will still be strengthened as we will be having more learners," she said and hoped learner-beneficiaries continue their studies at the University.//EMBawayan

Regional Knowledge Management Enhancement in Member Institutions of the CorCAARRD.

The program generally aims to mirror the function and initiative of the Department

of Science and Technology- Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources Research and Development (DOST-PCAARRD) Innovation and Technology Center (DPITC) in the Cordillera Administrative Region by providing assistance to the regional consortia on intellectual property management and transfer of technologies of consortia member institutions (CMIs). Specifically, the project goals include the establishment of the regional IP-TBM and regional agribusiness hub, provide support to Consortium Member Institutions (CMIs) and other ATBIs on the transfer of technologies and enhance the knowledge management services of selected CMIs.//ASantiago



In his speech, Dr. Sancho A.
