



BSU grad tops 2019 Librarian Licensure Exams

Daniel Jr S. Balbin, a BSU graduate of Bachelor of Library and Information Science emerged as 1st ranking examinee with a rating of 89.75 percent in the Librarian Licensure Examination held this month. The University also ranked 2nd top performing school in the same exam with a passing rate of 91.18%. Balbin led the BSU 2019 graduates as magna cum laude. Contrary to stereotypes about topnotcher students, Balbin is actually the kind that would mention Artekdotes (a Facebook page where people share personal narratives which is popular among the youth) in his college graduation valedictory speech and to liken graduation to the end of war continued on page 6

13 degree programs undergo AACCUP accreditation

The month of September witnessed 11 degree programs of BSU La Trinidad, Bokod and Buguias undergo tedious accreditation process by the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACCUP).

In La Trinidad, the degrees, Bachelor of Science in Nutrition and Dietetics, Doctor of Veterinary Medicine, Master of Science in Soil Science, Doctor of Philosophy in Horticulture and Master of Science in Rural Development were evaluated for Level 4, Phase 2 on September 2, 2019.

The survey team was led by Dr. Manuel T. Corpus who pointed out that out of more than 4,000 degree programs that AACCUP has accredited since 1992, only 50 are accredited Level IV.

"So kung nakapasa ka ng Level IV, para ng gumraduate ng summa cum laude," he said adding that Level IV accreditation no longer deals with the process but the impacts based on two indicators—licensure examination results and performance of graduates in tracer studies. **continued on page 6** BSU celebrates 103rd Foundation Anniversary, 119th Civil Service Month

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Department of Humanities faculty serve as lecturers in Taiwan

Taichung, Taiwan- Two faculty members of the Department of Humanities, College of Arts and Sciences were invited by National Chung Hsing University (NCHU) to facilitate a lecture on "Competence Building Workshop on Teaching and Presenting in English" on September 2-6, 2019.

Dr. Ronda B. Tullay and Dr. Kara S. Panolong presented topics on The English Language Landscape: Understanding the Use of English as a Global Language, Medium of Instruction and for Special Purposes, Lesson Strategies in Vocabulary, Lesson Strategies in the Art of Questioning, Providing Feedback, Making Effective Visuals, Paraphrasing and Transitions.

With around 30 professors from different fields of specializations, the workshop aimed to teach the participants to use techniques and strategies in using English as Medium of Instruction (MOI).

"Most of the participants are from the College of Veterinary Medicine and College of Agriculture and Natural Sciences. Their university offers international masters program in agriculture and that is why they will have to teach their subjects in English," shared Dr. Tullay.

According to Shaw-Yhi Hwang, NCHU's



Deputy Dean of the College of Agriculture and Natural Sciences, some of their professors just translate from Chinese to English making it essential to inform the professors what English as a Medium of Instruction (EMI) is, why it is needed and what are its potential benefits or challenges.

"The participants are actually schooled in the United Kingdom or the United States so it's not really the language but the teaching methods using EMI that we taught," said Dr. Tullay adding that one professor, after the lecture, realized she was too strict with her students so she resolved to be more 'human' as a professor.

The BSU-International Language Center, where Dr. Tullay is the director, was met by Shaw-Yhi Hwang while they were on an official visit in the University. A Memorandum of Agreement to make the program continuous is already underway hoping to involve more colleges in the University such as the College of Teacher Education and the College of Agriculture.

NCHU with 17, 259 students, is known in Taiwan for its breakthroughs in biotechnology, microbial biopesticides and plant disease control. //JSTabangcura

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BSU faculty and full-time researchers trained on publication writing



Thirty-five (35) technical and education research manucripts of Benguet State University faculty and fulltime researchers were converted into research articles during the Publication Writing Training-Workshop for Benguet State University (BSU) Faculty and Fulltime Researchers: Advancing Skills in Technical Research on September 2-6, 2019 at Awesome Hotel, San Juan, La Union.

The outputs of the participants will be considered for possible publication in the Mountain Journal of Science and Interdisciplinary Research (MJSIR) and high impact journals such as Scopus, Clarivate Journals and ASEAN Citation Index (ACI).

Consultant Dr. Lily Ann D. Lando, facilitated the 5-day activity in which she presented writing techniques and practices on how to write the parts of the research article and guided the participants on the writeshop proper. "Rejection is a norm in publication so don't be afraid to publish your research," encouraged by Dr. Lando.

On the other hand, Mr. Lauren P. Kipaan of the University Library and Information Services (ULIS) helped the participants in accessing online resources with BSU subscription and reminded the participants on using fair language on writing their research papers.

With the aim to boosts the number of BSU publication, this collaborative activity was funded by the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs (OVPAA) and Office of the Vice President for Research and Extension (OVPRE) implemented by the Research and Extension Publication Office (REPO) and Higher Education Regional Research Center (HERRC). //NLenguaje

The degrees Bachelor of Secondary Education and Bachelor of Elementary Education of BSU Buguias also under candidate status were likewise visited by the AACCUP survey team on September 2-4, 2019.

The exit conference and closing program for the said degrees under candidate status were attended by BSU officials including Vice President for Research and Extension (VPRE), Dr. Carlito P. Laurean and Vice President for Administration and Finance (VPAF), Dr. John James F. Malamug. Both officials gave their commitments after hearing the general impressions of the survey team.

"I will say that research and extension services of the University are support units for the development of academic programs. Actually, we have a new organizational structure in which the colleges have research centers aligned to their degree programs," Dr. Laurean said.

BSU student volunteers join International Coastal Cleanup (ICC) 2019

450 student volunteers participated in the International Coastal Cleanup Drive on September 26, 2019.

Student volunteers were able to accumulate 1,250 kilograms of trash along Tabangaoen, Central, Cabanao, Balili, and Benguet State University, Km. 6 La Trinidad, Benguet.

Steven A. Angelo, BSU Young Environmentalists Society President said that the involvement of the University in the cleanup drive is a way of contributing to nation building.

"Kaya naming ininvolve ang lahat (pertaining to students) because our main objective is to increase awareness on environmental issues (the reason we involved other student organizations was to increase awareness on environmental issues)," said Angelo.

The data accounted was submitted to the International Coastal Cleanup Philippines.



Based on the accounted waste collected by the students, the following were identified as the most in number: food wrappers, beverage plastic bottles, bottle caps, plastic/foam packaging, grocery bags, cigarette butts, take out/ away containers, among others. The trash collected were hauled by the Municipality of La Trinidad.

Angelo added that they conducted an orientation prior to the conduct of the clean-up drive which urged the students to participate in the global clean-up drive. This effort paved way for more students to join this year. In 2018, Philippines ranked first with more than 260,000 volunteers who participated in the worldwide clean-up based on a report published by the International Coastal Cleanup.
